**4. The Practice:**

The college organizes blood donation camp every year on the occasion of birth anniversary of late Padmabhushan Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil, founder of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha. In the academic year 2020-21, one blood donation camp was organized on 12<sup>th</sup> December 2020 by NCC department on the college campus. Total 31 units of blood were collected in this camp. The camp was organized in collaboration with Shri Chattrapati Shivaji Maharaj Sarvopachar Rughalay (Civil

Hospital) and Dr. Vaishampayan Memorial Government Medical College, Solapur. The refreshment and individual certificates are given to each blood donor as a token of gratitude. The collected blood units are carried by the respective authority and are deposited in the Government blood bank without applying any charge on it. Some of the donors who could not donate the blood this time were assured for donation in the next camp. Free blood coupons are handed over to the college.
